- A local non-profit uniting area students with senior citizens via free technology training courses
- A 501c3 organization, founded in 2012
- A zero-overhead organization, all proceeds go to educational programs for volunteers and students.

What we do for High School Students

- Enable students to teach, lead and organize basic technology courses for a variety of sizes
- Includes:
 - Engagement with community members (i.e. senior citizens, business professionals)
 - Development of communication and leadership skills for college and career aspirations
 - Opportunity to receive up to a \$1000 academic scholarship (per school)
- Improve senior citizens' access to, comfort with, and productive use of all technology
- Includes:
 - Engagement with local teens
 - Improved quality of life through increased access to local, national and global communities

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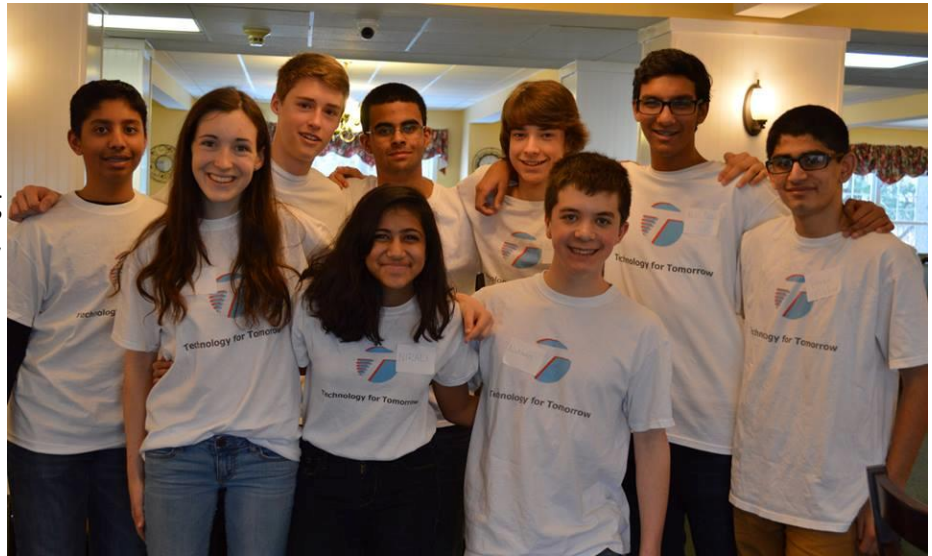


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Our Impact

- **165** senior citizens participating
- **151** student volunteers participating
- **902.5** total hours of free technology service
- **\$22,091** donation value of services, equipment and scholarships



How we work:

- Identify senior citizen senior homes and assess existing technology access and proficiency
- Recruit volunteers from local high schools and community service groups
- Work with volunteers to create standard and customized lessons for senior and community centers for topics of highest demand and impact
- Unite seniors, HS students and community volunteers through interactive workshops
- Survey participants to gather satisfaction and effectiveness data for continuous improvement
