On September 18th, Technology For Tomorrow participated in the Walk to End Alzheimer's at the Shelburne Museum in partnership with Desai Management Consulting. Thanks to generous donations, the combined team raised \$2,245.00 to donate to the Alzheimer's Association, putting the combined T4T/DMC team in 12th place overall for corporate team fundraising! Also, two Technology for Tomorrow participants were awarded Grand Champion status for raising over \$500.00 each! There were 878 participants at the Walk. Proceeds from the Walk will be dedicated to research and supporting those dealing with the disease.
