Tech Talk 2.0!

On Saturday, November 5th seventy-eight community members gathered at the F.H. Tuttle Middle School cafeteria to learn about technology. Williston-based nonprofit Technology for Tomorrow partnered with [AARP Vermont](#), [Small Dog Electronics](#), and [AT&T](#) to bring technology to the greater South Burlington community. Each partner led a 35 minute presentation followed by a Q&A session.

Twelve students from five area schools (South Burlington, Rice, MMU, CVU, and Williston Central School) also dedicated their time on Saturday morning to help make the event a success. The tech-savvy students were available as a resource for the event participants, answering technology questions ranging from internet safety and Facebook to wifi connectivity and wireless printing.

Ben Klein (sophomore at CVU) and Emilie McCormick (junior at MMU) led the final presentation of the day on Password Management. The students explained to the participants how to create and store secure passwords while their fellow volunteers worked one-on-one with event participants to answer their specific tech questions.

The Tech Talk 2.0 is a FREE educational workshop for community members that is hosted twice a year by Technology for Tomorrow. 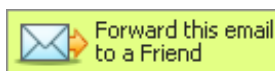
