

<u>Upcoming Summer TechTalk</u> - How to be a Good and Safe Participant in Today's Tech World, and What's This "Telehealth" I Keep Hearing About?

On Saturday, June 16th, 2018 community members will gather at the F.H. Tuttle Middle School cafeteria in South Burlington to learn about a number of relevant technology topics. Williston-based non-profit <u>Technology for Tomorrow</u> is partnering with <u>AARP of Vermont</u> and <u>The University of Vermont Health Network</u> to bring relevant and current technology information to the greater South Burlington community. Each organization will lead a 45 minute presentation followed by a Q&A session.

T4T will open by presenting information about what it means to be a *digital citizen*, and how that connects with various aspects of our life. AARP will then present information on common scams and how to protect yourself from them. Finally, The University of Vermont Health Network will provide the latest information on their Telehealth service, and how it applies to you.

Breaks will be taken between presentations, providing opportunities to talk directly to our T4T partners, and to enjoy refreshments.
