programs, we have begun providing online training programs in Connecticut, and have just established a partnership with Arizona State University to begin delivering training on a digital media literacy program developed by ASU. Please read on for greater details.

## **Community Impact...**



#### **Total Participants:**

In Quarter 4, 2020, T4T provided technology education and training to 331 individuals and hosted/enabled 67 events.

2020 Impact Report In 2020, Technology for Tomorrow had a great impact on many communities and community members. Please read our <u>2020 Impact Report</u> for more details. We served a total of 1,452 individuals. Of those, 44% were older adults while 13% were new Americans.



## **Vermont Program Updates**

#### Older Adults

We provided internet safety workshops in both English and Hindi to parents and loved ones of employees at Netspend.

T4T and Age Well are collaborating on a program for older adults to provide iPads and remote support and training for the older adult clients to access the internet and participate in the online virtual community as well as lessen their social isolation.

We are once again providing technical support to "Education and

Enrichment for Everyone" (EEE). Unlike past work centered at a physical location, we are now providing weekly lectures online as webinars where T4T assists in setting up and managing webinar content.

We provided a virtual Chromebook training session series in collaboration with the Champlain Senior Center as part of its programming for its older adults visitors.

We are partnering with the Central Vermont Council on Aging (CVCOA) to provide an iPad program for several older adults in central Vermont in order to help these individuals to break isolation and participate in the virtual worlds.



#### **New Americans**



We are collaborating with the U.S. Committee for Refugees and Immigrants (USCRI) Vermont to provide a virtual program for new Americans in Vermont on how to use a Chromebook and Zoom. Thank you Mascoma Bank and Ben & Jerry's for providing funding in order to enable this opportunity for new Americans in Vermont to access technology and English education online.

### **Home Education**

Due to the COVID-19 situation, we ramped up our online program to provided needed opportunities for children who were left with only <a href="https://example.com/home-education">home-education</a> in Vermont, across the US and around the world through the teaching platform Outschool.

#### **Workforce Development**

We provided online support and training for the Vermont Council of Special Education Administrators as it holds its annual conference, which is online this year. The training session focused on the Google Suite.

We provided a series of training sessions on various technologies for VocRehab and their clients focusing on how to get ready for entry level jobs requiring basic technology skills.



## **Connecticut Program Updates**

We collaborated with the Connecticut Healthy Living Collective and the AARP CT to provide support for a virtual webinar series for older adults in the state of Connecticut. We also provided support to the same organizations for their holiday bash in December for thousands of older adults through out Connecticut, participating online.



# **Texas Program Updates**

We provided internet safety workshops in both English and Hindi to parents and loved ones of employees at Netspend Corp., based in Austin.



We piloted a second chance training program in partnership with Building Promise, an Austin non-profit, to provide online workforce training to individuals currently in prison as well as formerly incarcerated individuals. The training program focuses on basic technology and job searching skills.



# **Arizona Program Updates**

We provided training session on how to use Zoom to various club leaders in Sun City West, a suburb of Phoenix.



We are partnering with the <u>Arizona State University News Co/Lab</u> to provide digital media literacy education programs for various audiences.
