Community Impact...



Total Participants:

In Quarter 2, 2021, T4T provided technology education and training to 292 individuals and hosted/enabled 63 events.

2020 Impact Report In 2020, Technology for Tomorrow had a great impact on many communities and community members. Please read our 2020 Impact Report for more details. We served a total of 1,452 individuals. Of those, 44% were older adults while 13% were new Americans.

Program Updates

Older Adults

In Vermont, T4T continued serving Age Well's iPad program participants through Q2 by providing them with remote support and training. This program, funded in part through an Aging Disability Resource Center (ADRC) initiative seeks to help older adults reduce social isolation and introduce them to virtual communities.

Again, in Vermont, T4T in collaboration with Central Vermont
Council on Aging (CVCOA) continued to support the iPad program
for older adults in Q2. We are expecting to execute a similar project in Q3 and Q4 of this year.

In Connecticut, T4T continued supporting CT Healthy Living Collective by providing 1:1 Zoom technical support to participants during their online programs.

For our second project in Connecticut during Q2, T4T teamed up with AARP Connecticut and

Arizona State University (ASU) to provide media literacy education to older adults. One workshop was completed in April with a second one scheduled on August 11 in our virtual classroom.

We continue to offer FREE 90-minute online classes through Zoom twice a month for older adults on basic technology skills and topics. Check out our <u>Calendar of Events</u> for event and registration information.

New Americans



Our collaborative effort with the U.S. Committee for Refugees and Immigrants (USCRI) in training new Americans continued through Q2 with the Digital Literacy class, which was well received.

Workforce Development

In Texas, during Q2, T4T successfully conducted a Zoom training session on creating and using Bitmoji Classrooms for the Girl Empowerment Network (GEN) Organization.

In Vermont, T4T started training participants preparing for the Microsoft Office Specialist (MOS) certification in collaboration with ReSOURCE. We offered our first session in the last part of Q2 in June.
