2023 Major Events

Microsoft TechSpark Roundtable

In December, Microsoft invited us to be a part of their TechSpark program, which seeks to promote digital skills and employability, increase access to broadband, and help local organizations thrive. We are now a proud TechSpark fellow.

In 2024, we will teach a 20-class series with two cohorts: The first group is focused on digital literacy, and the second group is focused on Artificial Intelligence.

We hosted a Roundtable Conversation with Vermont nonprofit and state leaders. Guests joined us from Microsoft, Associates for Training and Development, State Sen. Kesha Ram Hinsdale, Vermont Community Broadband, AARP Vermont, Wake Robin, Central Vermont Council of Aging, Champlain Valley Office of Economic Opportunity, Vermont Adult Learning, and many more. This event helped strengthen connections and set Technology for Tomorrow up for success in 2024.

We are proud to announce that two of our technology trainers, Becky Holt and Maliki LaForce, alongside our Executive Director Vijay Desai have been licensed through AARP's SeniorPlanet program. This has given us access to their curated lecture-based classes and resources.

With their materials, we hope to provide classes to many different audiences here in Vermont. Their bountiful library of lectures, including lessons on Internet of Things, TikTok, and many more, will increase efficiency and quality of our instruction in the coming year.

Mature Worker Workforce Program with A4TD

We kicked off our Mature Worker Workforce Program, in collaboration with Associates for Training & Development, in November. The project consists of nine cohorts of 10 individuals each. Participants are all looking to re-enter the workforce. Each cohort will take 12 classes, covering aspects of Microsoft 365, Google Workspace, and general digital literacy topics, including smartphones, computers, scam identification, and Zoom. This is one of our largest projects at Technology for Tomorrow, providing 108 total classes.

Vermont Works for Women (VWW) is grateful for its partnership with Technology for Tomorrow to teach an Introduction to Computer Literacy class as part of a grant with AALV to deliver career development workshops to New American and refugee women. The instructor, who taught the 12-week sessions to over 20 women, was personable, adaptable and creative, and successfully increased computer use knowledge for many women who had various levels of education and limited English language skills.

With the help of multiple language interpreters, (the T4T instructor) was able to quickly connect with the women, gain their trust and adjust her lessons to meet the individual needs of each participant. She even brought toys and activities for young children so their mothers could come to class and focus on their lessons. At the completion of the class, participants expressed gratitude for their new skills, reduced fear of using a computer, and a desire to continue their computer literacy journey. This class was the perfect beginning and springboard into the remaining career development workshops for women being delivered by VWW through the remainder of the grant period.

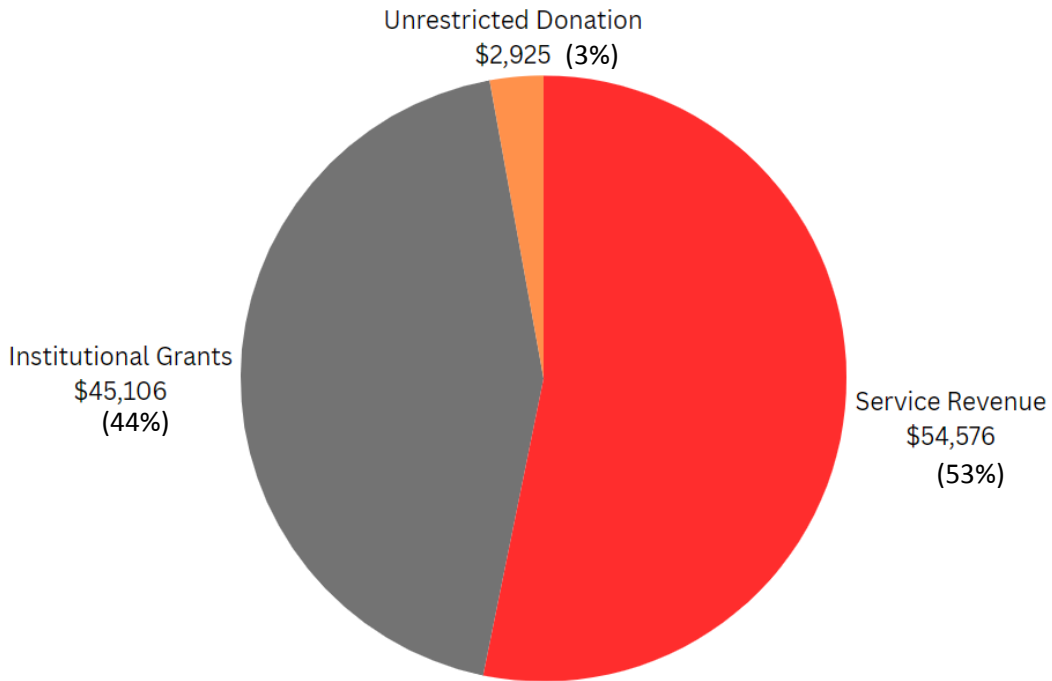

2023 Fiscal Year Financials

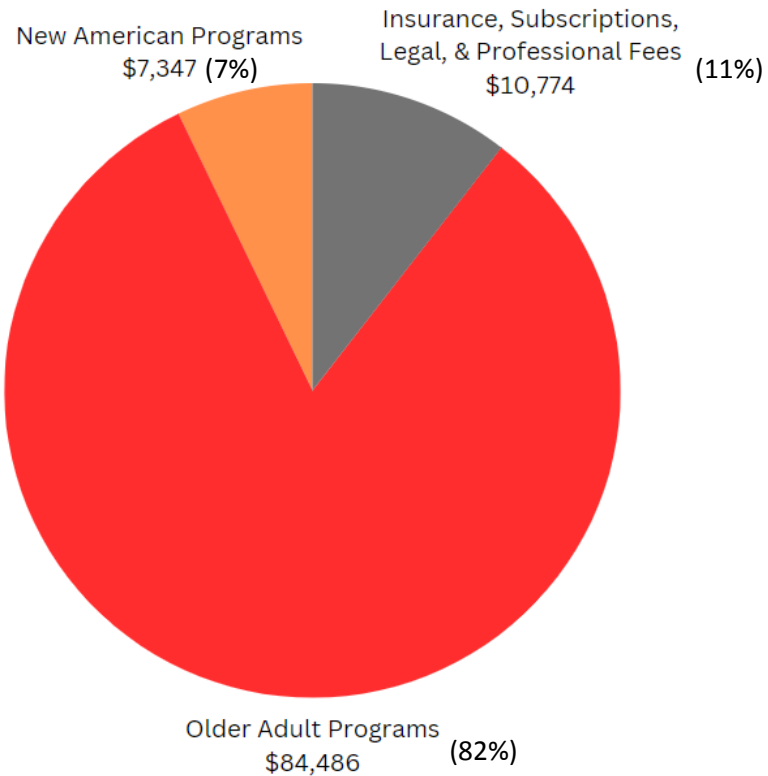
Revenue

Total: \$102,606

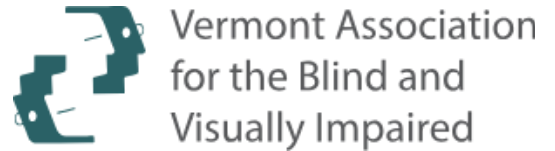


Expense
