Mature Worker Workforce Program 2025

We're thrilled to share that our current class series with **Associates for Training and Development (A4TD)** is successfully underway, and we're grateful to A4TD for their continued partnership and support of our mission to bridge the digital divide.

Thus far, 41 people, across four cohorts, have completed training. This quarter's classes focused on helping people develop digital literacy skills for new employment opportunities. We covered essential topics including scam prevention, smartphone and computer basics, and workplace programs like Microsoft 365 and Google Workspace.

We've loved watching our learners develop their skills each week and are proud of their progress toward new career opportunities.

Since February, we've been traveling from Burlington to Brattleboro to teach more than 80 students who are preparing for undergraduate programs across the country. In phase two, we covered Google Slides, Sheets, and Forms, building on the Google Workspace fundamentals we taught in phase one.

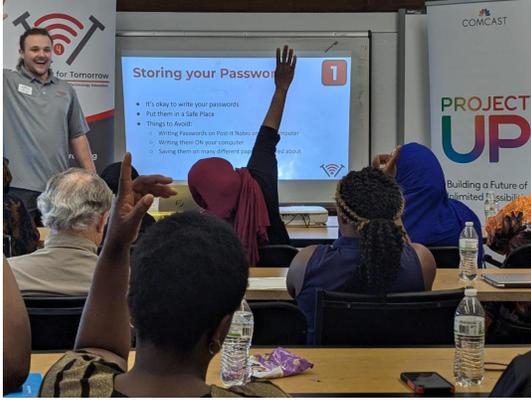

This quarter, our classes included lessons on smartphones, Google Photos, and online safety when dealing with scams and malicious AI usage.

Conferences



This quarter, we've had the incredible opportunity to attend two conferences. On May 17, our staff traveled back to [Champlain College](#) for [Burlington School District's](#) "Welcome All" conference, which focused on education with new Americans.

Maliki sat with Denise Torrey, and other organizations to discuss [Burlington Parent University](#), while Damien and Wolde delivered a talk on the use of Agile Methodology in a



classroom setting to adapt classes for all students.



Just days after, on May 19, Wolde, Damien and Vijay traveled to the Gila River Indian Community in Arizona to attend NDIA's "Net Inclusion 2025." This conference focused directly on digital equity, and bridging the digital divide.

Damien, Wolde, and Vijay made some incredible connections with organizations across the United States, and attended sessions on how digital equity intersects with multi-lingual learning, digital navigation, disability rights, and more.



On June 28, Maliki and Vijay attended the 2nd Annual Education and AI conference, hosted by aiVermont. They attended sessions on lesson planning, personalized learning, and the use of AI in the classroom. After the conference, Maliki remarked, "The conference really honed in on the reality of AI and opened the doors for discussion between educators. I'm excited to see the prospects of what AI can do for our public school teachers, learn it, and teach it to them."

From our Director



In December 2023, I arrived in the U.S from Afghanistan. I was stepping into an entirely different world, where nearly everything—finding a job, scheduling a doctor's appointment, paying for parking, or even getting a luggage cart at the airport—required interacting with technology. I still remember my very first day in the U.S., standing at John F. Kennedy Airport, unable to figure out how to take a cart because it required using a machine. I had no confidence to step towards it and try to figure it out. It was a small moment, but it highlighted a much bigger challenge: the digital gap that many new Americans face when starting their lives here.

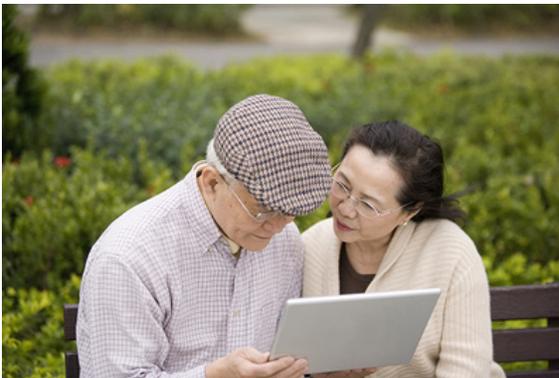
In Afghanistan, digital literacy is a privilege, not a given. Many people, including myself, grew up without access to a computer or exposure to the digital systems that are second nature to most Americans. But in the U.S., technology is not optional—it is essential. To access healthcare, you need to navigate MyChart or similar apps. To find a job, you must use online platforms. Even basic daily tasks require setting up accounts, verifying emails, and understanding digital security. Without these skills, new Americans can feel isolated, dependent on others, and unable to fully integrate into society.

That is why the work Technology for Tomorrow does is so meaningful to me. It's not just about teaching technology—it's about giving people the independence, confidence, and tools they need to rebuild their lives. I love everything T4T does, and I want to contribute in any way I can, whether by sharing my insights, supporting outreach, or helping expand our programs. I know firsthand how overwhelming this transition can be, and I want to be part of the solution for others facing the same challenges.

As of July 1, 2025, we have served **2,911** participants across **162** events, including workshops, webinars, and class series. These include **692** New Americans, **491** individuals seeking employment, and **745** Older Adults.

In 2024, we served more than 5,000 students across the entirety of the United States of America.
